

Letter from the Executive Director

Looking back, 2024 was a year of milestones, as the Washington Trust team worked to promote historic preservation, community placemaking, and cultural heritage in towns across the state.

Advocacy remained a cornerstone of our work. We made our annual sojourn to Washington, D.C., for Preservation Advocacy Week, meeting with our state's Congressional representatives to support federal preservation policies and funding. At the state level, we continued our work with lawmakers to showcase the importance of preservation as a valuable economic development tool. In partnership with the Department of Archaeology & Historic Preservation (DAHP), we supervised capital grant programs for historic barns, county courthouses, cemeteries, and theaters. We added three new listings to Washington's Most Endangered Places: the Ryan House in Sumner, a historic log cabin in Langley, and the Coupeville Wharf.

Our programs had stellar years as well. The Washington State Main Street Program, a DAHP program administered by the Washington Trust, celebrated its 40th anniversary in 2024. The Main Street network overall grew to 77 towns and cities with the addition of one new Community (Snohomish) and five new Affiliates (Cathlamet, Chewelah, Kirkland, Oakesdale, and Pioneer Square in Seattle). Our annual conference, newly rebranded as PLACES, traveled to Walla Walla, attracting 385 attendees and contributing \$175,000 to the local economy. We were awarded a Neighborhood Business Districts grant from the City of Spokane, which will support district improvements and organizational development in four of Spokane's historic neighborhood business districts starting in 2025.

In our second official year of activities for the Maritime Washington National Heritage Area, we hosted public and network events celebrating Washington's maritime history and heritage. Our Maritime Washington grant program awarded more than \$260,000 in subgrants. We welcomed a Mellon Humanities Postdoctoral Fellow, Dr. Meagan Harden, who will work with staff to pilot a new storytelling project in partnership with the Suquamish and Squaxin Island Tribes. Our video series "This is Maritime Washington," produced with Fishboat Media, won a regional Emmy Award! The Washington Trust also received its first-ever Paul Bruhn Historic Revitalization Grant from the National Park Service in 2024—funding which will enable us to establish a subgrant program to preserve and protect historic buildings facing coastal flooding and extreme weather events.

On the organizational front, our team undertook a months-long strategic planning process, in which we focused our vision for the future of the Washington Trust and the preservation movement writ large into specific guiding principles and strategic priorities that will chart our path across the next few years. That strategic plan will debut in 2025, in advance of our 50th anniversary in 2026. And while 2025 promises to be a year of great change, we are confident and committed to our ongoing work to fight for Washington's historic and cultural places, now and in the future.


